


OUR COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABLE CRUISING

Our cruises are carefully crafted to minimise any disturbance to fragile natural and cultural resources. Here are just some examples of our efforts:

- Expert-led environmental impact assessments are made for cruises in fragile environments
- Reduce emissions through the use of low sulphur marine gasoil and offset carbon emissions we cannot eliminate
- Ships are equipped with a chemical-free desalinisation system and a wastewater treatment system; use of recycled water in our laundry rooms

- Compact all waste, optimising storage and proper recycling
- Reduce single-use plastics where possible; continuous strive for further elimination
- Working with local communities when planning our cruises and actively engage with them what is shared from their culture and environment; supporting projects that preserve and maintain traditional cultures
- All ships are fitted out with 'dynamic positioning' technology which avoids the need to drop anchor and thus protects the seabed

Below you can have a taste of what our experts think about their role travelling with National Geographic Expeditions, which destinations to choose and how to have a positive impact when travelling.

What does being a National Geographic expert mean?

M Jackson, glaciologist and National

Geographic expert: I've been working with the National Geographic Society for around a decade—and it has consistently been one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. Expeditions that have a National Geographic expert are unique—guests have continual trip-long access to some of the world's leading experts in topics unique to each trip. I'm a glaciologist and have been working with ice worldwide for over a decade now, and I bring an enormous body of knowledge to these expeditions. As an expert,



I've also been trained by National Geographic in science communication—on how to share my knowledge in a way that transcends disciplines, backgrounds and languages.

Which destination should I choose: Antarctica or the Arctic?

Alastair Newton, Expedition Leader: Both are equally stunning! But looking more closely, these beautiful destinations could not be more different. The Arctic is a frozen ocean surrounded by the landmasses of various countries such as Canada and Greenland, whilst the Antarctic itself is a continent entirely covered by ice. You can only visit in the summer: the Arctic from May to September and the Antarctic between November and March. The Arctic is the only place to see polar bears hard to find though! There are also walrus and reindeer to be seen as well as whales and other marine life, and some extremely interesting indigenous communities living there that you can visit. The Antarctic, in contrast, has no land-based wildlife and no people living there (apart from a few scientists that run the research stations). But to see penguins, this is THE place! There are also whales, seals and many seabird species who make the Antarctic their home.

What is your role onboard our cruises and what do you like best about travelling with us?

Susan Seubert, National Geographic photographer: The food! Just kidding, although the food was exceptional. My role onboard includes helping people with their cameras, pointing out good photo opportunities, and getting people excited about taking good photographs. I try to be available as much as possible both on board the ship as well as in the field when we are experiencing the breath-taking nature of these amazing destinations. Areas such as Antarctica are unique environments with many opportunities to photograph the landscape as well as the wildlife. I show people how to take better photos, how to put together a story, and to offer technical advice about cameras and post-processing. I enjoy giving lectures and offer workshops on how to best use your iPhone for example. You definitely don't have to be a photography expert to enjoy taking great pictures!

How can our travellers have a positive impact? Robert Kunzig, Senior Environment Editor of

National Geographic Magazine: I think what is heartening to me about the relationship between PONANT and National Geographic is that we share the same basic values of trying to reduce our impact as much as possible, and we are on the same page as far as sustainability. People have to see a place to really understand it, and once they see it, I think a lot of them are changed forever. They go back home and they tell their friends and family about it, and this can be a very motivating factor. We have to love this planet in order to preserve it. We need people to share that feeling in order to get us all moving towards the goal of a sustainable Earth.



DID YOU KNOW?

Over four million people live within the Arctic Circle! Despite the harsh climate, many areas of the Arctic have been settled for thousands of years with indigenous peoples including the Saami in Finland, Sweden and Norway, the Nenets and Khanty peoples in Russia, and Inuit in Alaska, Canada and Greenland. Our polar expeditions will give you the opportunity to discover some of these ancient cultures, and understand how they have managed to make a living in this inhospitable part of the planet.



The Lacepede Islands is THE place to discover for bird watching as it is an important breeding area for sea birds. The breeding colony of Brown Boobies is possibly the largest in the world, with up to 18,000 pairs, while 20,000 Roseate Terns have also been recorded. Other birds include Masked Boobies, Australian Pelicans, Eastern Reef Egrets, Silver Gulls, Common Noddies, Lesser Frigatebirds, and Pied and Sooty Oystercatchers. Visiting wading birds also include Grey-tailed Tattlers, Bar-Tailed Godwits and Great Knots.


